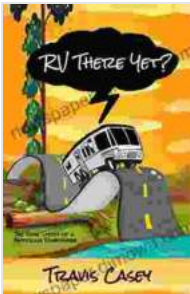


The True Story of Motoring Nightmare: Travis Casey's Real Life Adventures
