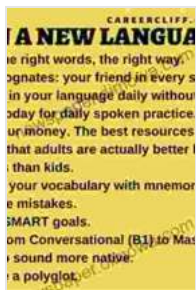

- 5 Singular and Plural**
Many new learners make mistakes in forming the plural form of singular nouns.

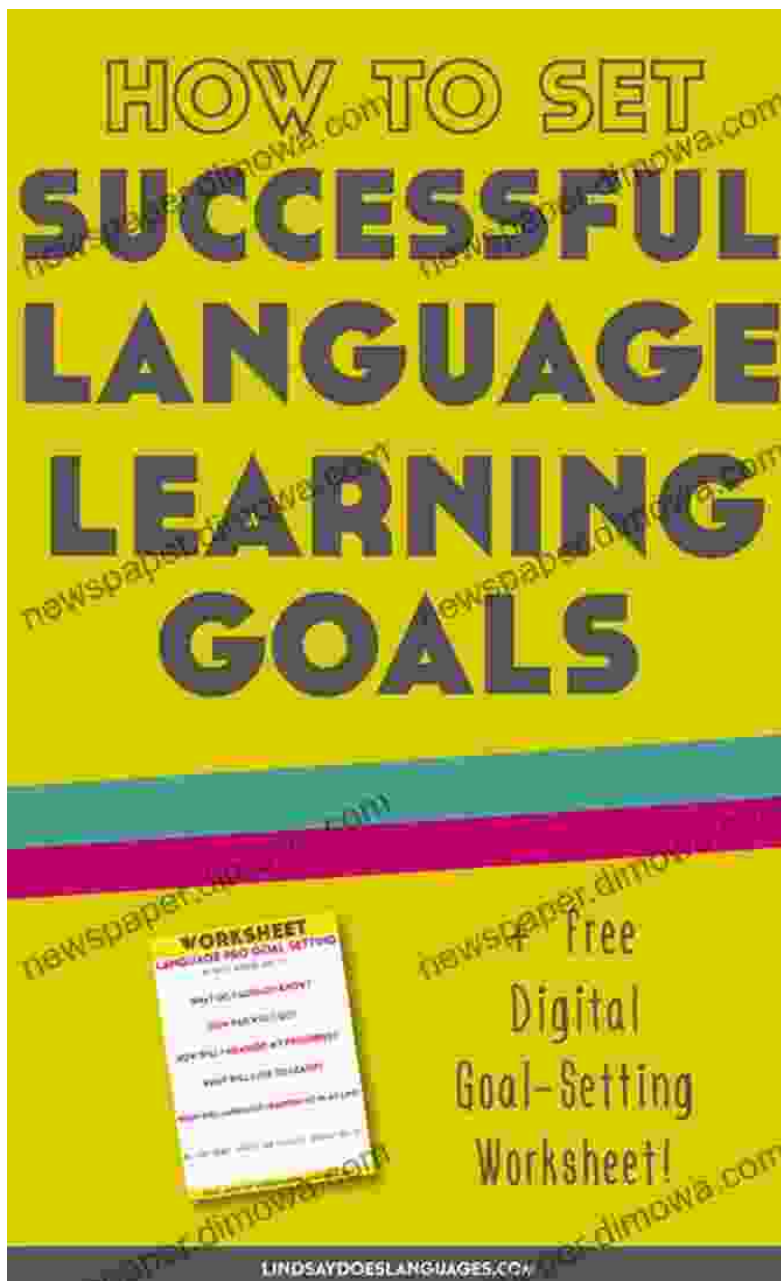
